Wed. 23 January, 2019 "ANZAC"

- The taking of Be'er Sheva from the Turks by the Australian & New Zealand Army Corps and other British forces, led by General Allenby.
- The movie will be introduced by an invited speaker from the Australian Embassy.

Wed. 6 February, 2019 "Luck & Good People"

- Maya, daughter of holocaust-survivor Irena Talmon, goes on an odyssey to Poland to find the families of 3 Polish women who helped her mother and others to escape the Nazis during WW2.
- With the participation of the producer.

Wed. 20 February, 2019 "Exodus"

- Based on Leon Uris' novel, this historical epic provides a dramatic backstory to the creation of the state of Israel in 1948, in the aftermath of World War 2
- Introduced and Q & A by Rabbi Ervin Birnbaum, who was on the Exodus.

Wed. 6 March, 2019 "Hill 24 doesn't answer"

- One of the first full-length feature films of the newborn state, it tells in a humorous way the story of the conflict between Israel and Egypt during the War of Independence.
- Includes free raffle.

Mon. 18 March, 2019 "Sallah Shabati"

- Iconic film about immigrants at the beginning of the state which won 2 Golden Globe awards and was the first Israeli film to be nominated for an Oscar. Repeat showing with one of the stars presenting.

Wed. 3 April, 2019 "Entebbe"

- The original film that told the story of the heroic release of hijacked plane passengers by the IDF.
